April Housing Matters

Q Shelter joins National Shelter in calling for the Federal Government to commit to a National Summit and National Housing Strategy. Given the scale of housing need emerging among households who have never faced housing insecurity before, it is critical to have national leadership where all levels of government and key stakeholders are called together to solve the housing crisis.

We have released our new <u>policy statement</u> which outlines an integrated approach to housing supply, tenancy sustainment support and policy reform. We have also commissioned work to detail how planning system reforms can support housing outcomes. We are also working with Urbis on a social inclusion framework with housing at the centre leading up to the Olympics.

In the last week I have joined Noosa Mayor Clare Stewart on an Urban Development Institute of Australia (UDIA) panel on the Sunshine Coast. It is inspiring to see leaders embrace the challenges and propose solutions. We are working with a number of local governments around the State to advance housing solutions from this vital tier of Government.

We have also worked with REIQ CEO Antonia Mercorella to call for property owners to consider whether they have property that could offer private rental options for people who have nowhere to live. We have been working with the Minister for Housing Leeanne Enoch to advance these ideas to ensure that in the very short term we are encouraging property owners to think about what they can do with under-utilised properties, short-term rentals, and buildings that could be adapted for housing. It is not the whole answer but it might ease the rental crisis and help programs like Help to Home succeed.

Research & Policy

Supported by Q Shelter, National Shelter, and other organisations, the **ACOSS/UNSW Sydney Poverty and Inequality Partnership** have released the third and final report in a series examining the affects of Covid-19 on housing and homelessness policy. **The most recent report** includes an international review.

Infrastructure Australia have released their <u>inaugural report.</u> In four QLD regions, access to available, diverse, and affordable housing was identified as a key gap. You can find <u>Queensland specific research here.</u>

Australian Housing and Urban Research Institute have released a <u>new report:</u> What works to sustain Indigenous tenancies in Australia. "With around 60 per cent of Indigenous Australians living in rental accommodation (compared to around 30 per cent of non-Indigenous Australians who rent) understanding what makes Indigenous tenancies work successfully is vital".

QLD Government: <u>Grants of up to \$50,000 are available for affected non-profit organisations</u> following South East Queensland Rainfall and Flooding to hire or purchase equipment and materials, clean up, remove debris, repair or replace damaged infrastructure or goods and other costs associated with the recovery process.

CommBank Flood Relief Grants: <u>Grants of up to \$10,000 are available to not-for-profit and community organisations</u> directly impacted by the floods or directly supporting relief, recovery and resilience efforts.
