# **April Housing Matters**

#### Housing on the national agenda

It has taken a pandemic and more natural disasters but finally housing is on the agenda in the lead up to the national election. With more ideas in the mix, we have a stronger basis for ensuring the discussion converts to implementation with real investment as the campaign draws to a close. Q Shelter is part of the National Shelter Council who is working collaboratively with CHIA National and the Everybody's Home Campaign to engage with every major party and all independents calling for their commitment to real housing solutions. Join the National Shelter Forum on Friday.

#### Greater grass-roots involvement

There is more grass-roots involvement in trying to improve housing availability and affordability around the State. We spent yesterday with the Sunshine Coast Housing and Homelessness Network in a strategic planning session which was attended by community members and local businesses with significant commitment to housing solutions. Election-focussed advocacy has its place but deeper engagement at the grass-roots is the real context for change.

#### The future of strategic regional networks

Q Shelter works with many regional networks on focussed action planning. There is a trend with regional networks focusing less on information sharing and more on agreed actions and monitoring progress. We love helping regional networks focus their efforts and maximise their impact. Our next Regional Representatives Forum will bring together regional plans of action with training plans in each region to support our hard-working sector.

Q Shelter ED, Fiona Caniglia, has also <u>welcomed the announcement.</u>

Registrations are now open for the <u>National Shelter Federal Election Housing Forum</u> on Friday 6 May, with an opportunity to ask candidates about their housing policies.

# **Service Integration**

As we move toward the winter months, work within the Service Integration Initiative certainly isn't cooling down! In addition to continuing to enhance processes, frameworks and participation in multi-disciplinary care coordination, there is a packed calendar of other capability-building and planning events across the State.

Hoarding & Squalor training is planned in Cairns, Townsville and Mackay during June. This will follow a regional strategic planning workshop being held at the end of May. Deescalation training is also being planned for July in Townsville, whilst 'Feeling the Pulse' and 'Place-Based Leadership' workshops are occurring in Mackay during May. Regional strategic planning is also underway in the Sunshine Coast and Moreton Bay regions. Stakeholders across Redlands are currently designing a new networking framework covering the entire service system. Additionally, Redlands stakeholders will join with Logan stakeholders to deliver an 'education day' for non- housing and homelessness services in mid June.

Structurally, several other key pieces of work are underway: further enhancements to the Initiative's Client Management System, along with refinements to the evaluation framework to test outcomes and impact. We welcome Emma Irvine-Collins who will be the project lead across the co-design of a capability building framework. This framework will support regional service systems to identify, escalate and ultimately participate in workforce, organisational, and system-level learning and development opportunities.

The Tenancy Skills Institute is delivering Skillsets for Successful for Tenancies - a free tenancy skills course - on 24 and 25 May 2022 in Mackay. The training is designed to help tenants secure and keep a rental property by developing key knowledge and critical skills needed to rent successfully. Topics covered include communication, rights & responsibilities, maintaining and cleaning a property, finance and budgeting. The first Gympie Care Coordination Group (GCCG) recently met to support a number of older vulnerable persons who have been displaced by the recent Gympie floods and who have very few supports in place.

While the current membership of GCCG is still small, the group looks forward to providing coordinated care and wrap-around supports to persons at risk of, or experiencing homelessness.
