#### CEO and Leaders' Forum examines future fit leadership

- A second dialogue will demonstrate the extent of concurrent effort across the private sector, peaks, and Government to address community sentiment about housing diversity.
- The third will consider a horizon where philanthropy including a Queensland Housing Trust can play a part in diversifying funding for social and affordable housing supply.


