Theme: Sport, Health and Social Inclusion



Desired Outcomes

- A more physically active, and healthy community.
- Enhanced pathways for elite athletes, including First Nations and people with disability.

Some of the ideas we have heard so far through the community engagement process:

Sport for Every Child

School and community sport funded to allow every child to participate at least once a week.

Oceania of Sport

Building pathways for community and elite athlete participation across the Oceania region - including coaching, mentoring, scholarship and inspiration.

Paralympic Centre of Excellence

A training, athlete development and accreditation facility to enhance research and participation for all athletes with disability.

Volunteer Passport

Build the volunteering culture, skills and capacity to deliver a great games and grow volunteers in sport and community activities.

Indigenous Excellence in Sport

An innovative program that attracts and develops First Nations athletes across Queensland, Australia and Oceania.

Sporting Futures Fund + Regional Sporting Hubs

Enable community clubs to access the training and resources they need for athletes to remain in their home regions - for the benefit of both the athlete and their community.

Olympic and Paralympic Housing Trust

Explore potential for using the athletes' villages across the region to help address affordable housing supply.

Elite Athlete Pathway Program

Support for high performance athletes at every stage of their career.

To Whom It May Concern,

Q Shelter welcomes the opportunity to provide a written submission to the Legacy Consultation. The <u>Go</u> <u>for Gold Report</u> outlines our concerns and suggestions more fully.

We consider the Games will cause inflationary pressure on housing markets in Queensland due to pull factors relating to tourism and the surge workforce required to build infrastructure projects. We also consider that improvements to liveability and places will also cause housing markets to inflate and the population to gentrify.

For that reason, we consider the following vitally important:

- Undertake a full socio-economic impact assessment of the Games to identify specific strategies and actions to ensure key locations remain inclusive, accessible and affordable to people currently living here and to people in the lowest 40 per cent of the income spectrum.
- Commence monitoring housing markets in key locations to understand the extent to which local people are being displaced. Also monitor the impacts on locations people are pushed to, so that services, support and housing are adequate to meet needs.
- Ensure major contractors identified through procurement projects related to the Games are required to outline a housing strategy for their workforce
- Develop a workforce housing plan to ensure local people aren't displaced
- Establish a housing trust to capture funds from procurement processes, other philanthropy and grassroots participation that can be used across all regions to invest in increased social and affordable housing
- Invest now in supportive housing in all population centres to ensure complex homelessness is addressed ahead of 2032 in favour of immediate crisis responses at the time to remove people into temporary accommodation for the duration of the games
- Ensure the athletes' villages result in a transfer of housing stock to community housing providers to be delivered in perpetuity for social and affordable housing
- Involve community housing providers in the provision of real estate services related to the future of athletes' villages as rental accommodation and when properties are sold.
- Ensure procurement processes increase opportunities for people who are unemployed or underemployed to participate in the economic gains resulting from the Games.

In summary, Q Shelter draws attention to the major risks associated with hosting the Games because of the risk of displacement and reducing affordability. We are committed to working with government and the wider housing system to ensure the core negative impacts from the Games are managed while there is a legacy of increasing supply of social and affordable housing through housing transfers, expanded supportive housing, and the establishment of a Housing Trust.
