## **Supporting the Voice**

Q Shelter's team, led by the Diversity and Inclusion Working Group, went through a collaborative learning process to discuss and understand The Voice to Parliament. We have <u>published a statement explaining why we support The Voice without hesitation</u>.

More Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples are represented among homeless people, are more likely to rent and less likely to own a home, The Voice is critically important to embedding a mechanism for advice and influence by First Nations Australians.



Q Shelter supports the Voice to Parliament, without hesitation, as we reflect on the past and imagine a better future together.



## The rights of children and young people

This week I have written to twelve Ministers, including the Premier, to voice my concerns about the incarceration of children and young people in adult correctional facilities. We are **on the record in multiple submissions** calling for significant investment in prevention so that children and young people are supported and safe, allowing them to participate in education and broader community life.

The evidence about the impacts of adverse events during pregnancy and the first 1000 days of life is compelling. Children exposed to adverse events such as violence are more

likely to intersect with child protection and criminal justice systems. They are also more likely to emerge into complex homelessness in later life.

Q Shelter will pursue an active dialogue with all decision makers to <u>encourage a shift in focus to prevention</u>, so that children can flourish and communities are safe. We want to see a significant investment in evidence-based programs in the next State Budget.

## South-East Queensland Regional Plan

Q Shelter is immersed in developing a response to the <u>Draft South-East Queensland</u> <u>Regional Plan</u>. I was pleased to <u>join the Deputy Premier in the announcement</u> about the consultation phase and encourage everyone concerned with housing supply and affordability <u>to write a submission</u>. As a sector we need to support the ambitious targets for social and affordable housing and also help defined a roadmap for how this can be achieved.

## Workforce Wellbeing, Attraction and Retention

We are <u>travelling the state with Homelessness Queensland</u> to co-design responses to workforce wellbeing, attraction, and retention. It is a critical issue for our sector, and we look forward to developing a response that will make a meaningful difference.

# New AHURI Research on Crisis Accommodation in Australia

Today AHURI released a new research report, <u>Crisis accommodation in Australia: now</u> and for the future.

The report details the support and services provided by Specialist Homelessness Services (SHS) to the 160,000 people who seek crisis accommodation in Australia every year.

AHURI summarises the key finding from the research as follows:

• Many more people need crisis accommodation than can access it.

- Specialist homelessness Services are forced to use purchased, short-term accommodation, such as boarding houses, motels and caravan parks. This accommodation is often inappropriate and provides inadequate support.
- Less than a third of people who stayed in crisis accommodation exited into long term accommodation.

The research was carried out for AHURI by Swinburne University, Launch Housing, University of South Australia and Flinders University.

## **Growing Child Safe Organisations in Queensland**

The Queensland Government is seeking feedback on options for the implementation of child safe standards and a reportable conduct scheme in the state. They have <u>published</u> the consultation regulatory impact statement (CRIS) and are now seeking input from the public, with the consultation period closing at **5pm**, **Friday 22 September 2023**.

Public consultations will consist of written submissions, online general information sessions, and targeted consultations with key groups (children and young people; Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander stakeholders including children and young people and organisations; and any regulators or stakeholder groups identified by departments as candidates for a targeted session to work through specific issues).



## Logan

Logan has been planning for the for next 'Tenancy sustainment support for Real Estates' event. Two planning meetings have been held during the month of August. The event date has been confirmed for 27 October 2023 and an Eventbrite invitation will soon be available for registrations. Guest speakers will include Q Shelter, SSI, YFS, Kingston East Neighbourhood Group, and Wesley Mission STARH program, with the view to educating real estate staff on services that their tenants can access in order to gain support with sustaining their tenancies.


