A housing plan for Queensland

Q Shelter is eagerly anticipating the announcement of the Queensland Housing Plan called 'Homes for Queenslanders'. Just this morning we joined the team at 3rd Space in Brisbane as the Premier, Treasurer and Minister for Housing, Local Government and Planning announced that every Specialist Homelessness Service in the state would receive a 20 per cent increase in funding under the new plan.

The other positive announcement today was extra funding to support a two-worker model for six SHS after-hours services. This will mean faster help for people experiencing homelessness, and a safer and more sustainable environment provided for frontline staff.

In addition to today's announcement of a boost to social housing funding, the Premier has highlighted that the wider scope of the plan includes building more homes faster and working to end homelessness.

Q Shelter is hoping the Plan moves us from crisis management to prevention. While we need measures for the current situation, we also need action now to ensure we are designing and delivering a system that achieves prevention of homelessness and unmet housing need. We will be carefully assessing whether the comprehensive solutions outlined in our pre-budget submission 'Better Together' have been adopted.

Busy start to the year as the sector prepares for housing growth

Everyone I speak to has had a busy start to the year. As always, our members and stakeholders are addressing presenting needs and in the case of community housing providers, preparing submissions to various funding opportunities including QuickStarts and the Housing Australia Future Fund. It is great to see funding opportunities yet there is still so much work to do to ensure Queensland has a fair share of the available funding.

That is why we are working hard with <u>CHIA Queensland</u> and <u>Aboriginal and Torres</u>

<u>Strait Islander Housing Queensland</u> to deliver the <u>Community Housing Futures</u>

<u>Program</u>. While the program is delivering capacity building activities, the Peaks remain consistent in our advocacy for improved policy settings supporting Community Housing Providers to grow. We can't overlook structural barriers that prevent success.

Learning Exchange focus on poverty reduction

Australia has a growing problem with poverty as <u>a recent report from ACOSS</u> highlights. Poverty is a significant factor in homelessness and housing stress, so <u>our first Learning Exchange session for the year will explore how poverty is being addressed through a national plan in Canada</u>. Governed by legislation, a progressive definition of poverty and robust monitoring and reporting, we have a lot to learn from early signs of success.

<u>Join me as I moderate a session with Scott MacAfee</u>, who will help us understand the initiative in Canada, with opportunities for questions and discussion.

Queensland Local Government Elections

In the lead-up to the local government elections in mid-March, Q Shelter has been inviting candidates from across the political spectrum to consider our policy framework for housing need and homelessness.

Early in January, we sent a summary of our policy positions relevant to local governments to all registered candidates in the 77 electorates. You can <u>read the letter and the policy summary on our website</u>.

As the peak body representing the housing and homelessness sector in Queensland, we recognise the important separation of responsibilities between the three tiers of federal, state and local government, while also emphasising the three critical areas of focus for local governments, including responding to homelessness, planning levers, and innovation and partnership.

We've appreciated the conversations we've already had with several candidates from different electorates, and the time they've taken to check in on how they could shape their positions to best provide potential solutions.

Everyone is invited to join our online Candidates' Forums for Southeast Queensland councils on 12 February, and for Regional Queensland on 19 February. It's your opportunity to engage with as many candidates as possible on the issues and possible responses to housing security and homelessness.


Tenancy skills training

Wide Bay

Wide Bay now has two panels operating – Fraser Coast covering Hervey Bay and Maryborough, and the second, launched in December 2023, covering Bundaberg and Childers.

Fraser Coast panel meets online through Microsoft Teams on the **third Thursday of each month** or as required, and Bundaberg panel meets on the **first Thursday of each month**, also online via Teams. Both meetings start at **10.30am** and referrals should be in at least 4 days prior to enable adequate time for panel members to review the information after they have received it.

In January 2024, I was invited to tour the newly opened Mental Health facility at Hervey Bay Hospital. It is a state-of-the-art facility for 22 people, with separate facilities for those with severe mental health issues and those with improving mental health capacity. This is an increase in support for people with mental health problems although that will not be fully experienced for the next 10 months (approximately).

Maryborough Mental Health facilities will now be shut down and re-furbished during which time they will be re-locating people to Hervey Bay. Following that, the facility in Maryborough will re-open for people who need support with their mental health difficulties and Hervey Bay will be functioning only from its catchment area.
