Dear Colleagues,

It is truly a time when things are shifting in our sector. There are three things in particular I want to call out today.

On <u>Wednesday the Federal Housing Minister confirmed</u> that the Commonwealth will not reduce funding for homelessness services beyond June 2024. This win for front-line services has come through the positive advocacy and lobbying of key partners and stakeholders across our sector, and <u>addresses the \$73m shortfall resulting from the</u> <u>Equal Remuneration Order (ERO)</u>.

Secondly, for those who haven't yet had the chance, I strongly encourage you to familiarise yourselves with the *Homes for Queenslanders* housing plan and our recent responses. Q Shelter has made our position clear on the plan, which I believe is <u>a once-in-a-generation opportunity</u> for us to come together to make this suite of policies, investments and reforms shape Queensland's housing system for the better, long into the future.

Finally, last week I presented <u>Q Shelter's submission to the Inquiry into the Provision</u> and <u>Regulation of Supported Accommodation in Queensland</u>. I found it a privilege to speak on behalf of our sector, to underscore the need to find far-reaching and structural recommendations that will support some of the most vulnerable people in our community.

Thanks to all our members, active stakeholders and supporters who have helped to shape and deliver these changes.

You'll soon start to see the wellbeing resources that have been developed with your input, and which we believe will go some way to supporting us all to prioritise self-care and commit to long-term wellbeing.

Over the next few months, members of the Q Shelter team will be visiting a number of

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regions as part of the Workforce Connect Program. In this round of visits, the team will present the resources they have developed as a result of the initial consultation, and seek feedback. Besides the crucial feedback and input we receive at these meetings, I really value the opportunities to see firsthand the remarkable work being done in our sector for the community, and to connect with the individuals driving these efforts.

I encourage you to share your positive work experiences in the sector with your networks. We'll have resources to share shortly, but there's also a big role we can all play in attracting people to a career in housing and homelessness.

Talking to local government

Finally, I encourage you all to actively engage with your local councils, aspiring councillors and mayoral candidates to understand what they can bring to the housing and homelessness space. Q Shelter has <u>written to all candidates across Queensland</u> to highlight the solutions that local councils can bring to housing need in their areas, which you could use as a conversation starter with your own local candidates or council members. Additionally, it's worth keeping an eye on the upcoming by-election for the former Premier's seat in Inala, also being contested on 16 March.

National Affordable Housing Summit

Q Shelter's Executive Director, Fiona Caniglia, was honoured to attend the CHIA National Affordable Housing Development and Investment Summit held in Melbourne this week.

Fiona's high points include:

- A deep dive into Build-to-Rent opportunities, and how to ensure these opportunities include a role for Community Housing Providers (CHP) delivering affordable homes in perpetuity.
- Inspiring case studies from local governments who are delivering innovative programs and projects responding to housing needs and homelessness.
- A panel of investment institutions exploring how investment can be facilitated and structured to achieve social and affordable housing.
- A session exploring how to build community support for social and affordable housing solutions.

Fiona saw many of the CHP representatives very busy at the Summit, as they were also working on proposals for growth projects.

Quickstarts

<u>QuickStarts Qld – Round 2</u> is currently open and seeking proposals from registered community housing providers or their partner organisations to increase the supply of social housing in target regions through new construction projects or acquisition of new off-the-plan, turn-key projects.

Housing Australia Future Fund (HAFF)

Applications for Funding Round One under the Housing Australia Future Fund Facility (HAFFF) and National Housing Accord Facility (NHAF) are now open. The following entities are eligible to apply for funding under the HAFFF and NHAF:

- Community housing providers that are registered under the National Regulatory System for Community Housing and are registered charities.
- Australian States and Territories, local governing bodies, and Local, State or Territory government-owned corporations.
- Charitable entities with a primary purpose of improving housing outcomes for Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander people, or for current or former members of the Australian Defence Force.
- Special Purpose Vehicles (SPV) whose purpose is to increase social and/or affordable housing, where at least one member is an entity mentioned above.

Workforce Connect

Wellbeing Framework

In partnership with Homelessness Queensland, during August-November 2023 we completed regional engagements in 14 locations to co-design a wellbeing framework in addition to discussing ideas for workforce attraction and retention. A survey was developed through co-design and administered through various pathways involving the peak organisations involved in the project, the Services Union and leaders in the sector. We received 450 responses to the survey which was open during September to December 2023.

Additionally, we worked with CHIA Queensland to undertake in-depth interviews during November 2023 to February 2024 with sector leaders to further refine ideas and suggestions for workforce wellbeing, attraction and retention.

We have analysed regional engagement input and survey results for themes which have been translated into the draft wellbeing framework, wellbeing resources, sector promotional tools, and potential strategies and actions.

The preliminary literature review was also completed to guide subsequent stages of the project.

Sector Promotion

Events at universities, career expos, schools, TAFEs, and job networks have been booked in and our first event was this week, with many more to come. We have engaged marketing agency Narrative Hub to undertake a promotional and digital marketing campaign for the sector. This will include a website page with information about pathways into the sector, videos with sector colleagues about their work in the sector and a social media campaign.

Next Steps

We've valued the sector's input from our consultations and survey, which has led to the development of a draft Wellbeing Framework and associated resources. Before we launch, we'd now like to hear your feedback on the draft Framework and resources produced. Join us at one of our free workshops hosted by Q Shelter and Homelessness Queensland. Lunch is provided at each session and offers you the chance to review and provide feedback to finalise the documents.

Townsville Youth Foyer

The Youth Foyer model is built on six services: Education, Employment, Health and Wellbeing, Social Connections, Civic Participation, and Housing and Living Skills.

Young people sign a lease, pay rent and bond, and commit to a "deal" to participate in those six services. We offer a supported tenancy for up to two years, and young people agree to House Rules.

Each young person has their own fully furnished one-bedroom unit with kitchen and washing machine. We support them to develop their living skills including shopping, cooking, cleaning, budgeting etc. while pursuing their education and employment goals. The goal is to transition a young person to a thriving independent future after the Foyer. This is an internationally accredited program supported by the <u>Foyer Foundation</u>.

The Youth Foyer may not suit all young people and we have systems and tools to help us engage young people to determine if the Foyer is right for them. The link below provides some information as well as our Expression of Interest form. A young person who may be interested can complete the EOI form or call us for more information. Information sessions for young people and our formal intake processes will commence in late March, and we hope that by April/May we can start to slowly move young people in to commence their Foyer journey with us.

As you can see, construction is well underway and hoping to be open in the coming months. There are a number of <u>vacant positions for the Foyer currently listed on the</u> <u>Mission Australia website</u>.
