Welcome to a new State Government

The Queensland State Election has delivered a new Government. We <u>congratulate Premier David Crisafulli and his team</u> and look forward to a productive working relationship to address one of the highest priorities for Queenslanders: addressing unmet housing needs and homelessness.

We thank outgoing Premier Steven Miles and his team for their service and for delivering the landmark *Homes for Queenslanders* Plan. We particularly thank Meaghan Scanlon for her effort and commitment in bringing forward this Plan and for working hard to accelerate its implementation. We have enjoyed a productive and respectful working relationship and thank you all for your commitment to addressing disadvantage in Queensland.

In the runway to the election, Q Shelter called for momentum in delivering *Homes for Queenslanders*, while also calling for additional measures such as a target to end homelessness by 2032. We have reached out to the new Government to continue our engagement with them to not only call for solutions but to assist in their successful implementation.

Q Shelter and partners launched the Displacement Monitoring Report

We are seeking to learn lessons from the past and prevent displacement due to mega events and programs of urban renewal. With AHURI, and partners The Salvation Army, Communify, Micah Projects, Brisbane Youth Service, Committee for Brisbane, inCommunity, and YFS, Q Shelter has launched a world-first report establishing a displacement monitoring framework that will help us understand housing market impacts in the runway to the Olympics. We sincerely thank AHURI and our partners for their contributions and will use the report to amplify the need to prevent displacement and address the causes in real time.

Regional Representatives, CEO and Senior Leaders Forum and Q Shelter AGM and End of Year Celebration

We look forward to welcoming the Regional Representatives, CEOs and senior leaders and our members in two days of conferencing, engagement and policy development. Community Housing Futures

Seeking input on future program priorities

Community Housing Futures commenced in January 2023 with a two-year funding commitment from the Queensland Government. On Monday 30 September, the Queensland Government announced continued support for the Community Housing Futures program, including an additional \$4m boost as part of their Homes for Queenslanders plan. We are now seeking to consult with Community Housing Providers to investigate future priorities for the program.

As part of this process, we will:

- develop a discussion paper collating any ideas for capacity-building support that have been identified so far through the program
- discuss options and seek your views on priorities at a workshop, with the option to attend in person or online.

Research participation opportunity

Impacts of workplace trauma and psychosocial hazards on frontline workers in social housing and homelessness services in Australia

A <u>new research project funded by Australian Housing and Urban Research Institute (AHURI)</u> is seeking to inform improvements in the prevention and management of workplace trauma in the homelessness and social housing sectors.

The project researchers are calling for participants for their online survey, seeking input from frontline staff in social housing and homelessness services across a variety of roles.


