New dates for Applied Suicide Intervention **Skills training**

This two-day, in-person workshop is now booked in for Wednesday 19 and Thursday 20 February 2025.

ASIST is the only workshop of its kind — participants learn an evidence-based suicide intervention model to intervene and help prevent the immediate risk of suicide. Developed in 1982 and regularly evaluated and updated to reflect bestpractice in suicide prevention, ASIST has over 30+ peer-reviewed studies proving its ability to reduce thoughts of suicide for those at risk.

Community Housing Futures

Thank you to everyone who participated in our recent industry consultations to investigate future priorities for the Community Housing Futures Program (CHFP). The input received, along with the evaluation report due for completion by AHURI, will help inform what iteration two of the program will look like.

The joint program partners – CHIA Queensland, ATSIHQ, and Q Shelter – continue to engage with the Queensland Department of Housing and Public Works on the future initiatives of the program, and we expect to be able to provide more of an update in early 2025.

The CHFP was established to enhance the capability and capacity of Community Housing Organisations to increase social and affordable housing supply in Queensland. So far, the Program has supported CHOs to access grants for specialist business advisory services, growth readiness assessments, and growthrelated training, education and tools. National Elder Abuse Research Program

The Australian Attorney-General's Department has commissioned and funded the Australian Institute of Family Studies, partnering with Queerspace, to undertake research on the abuse and mistreatment of lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, intersex, queer, and/or asexual (LGBTIQA+) older people.

The research will help improve understanding of the experiences of abuse and mistreatment among LGBTIQA+ older people by examining the nature and dynamics of this abuse and mistreatment, its effects, and what effective service responses look like from the perspective of this LGBTIQA+ people.

LGBTIQA+ adults of all ages are invited to participate through an online survey, interviews, and/or focus groups. <u>Visit the AIFS website for full details</u>.
