



From our Leadership Team

January has been a busy month across the sector due to the ongoing need for housing and homelessness support through the community. Encouragingly, we have also seen the new Queensland Government take action on a number of promises since they took office.

The two most recent announcements have confirmed:

- the 20% funding uplift for Specialist Homelessness Services will be included in next year's budget and reflected in contracts out to 2027-28
- commitment to eight new Youth Foyers in Queensland, with three in the new budget and five to be funded in future allocations.

Yesterday we welcomed close to 100 people from across the sector, Q Shelter members, stakeholder groups and government representatives to our **100 Days of Impact** webinar. We outlined the engagement we have had with government and our advocacy partners over the past few months, launched our <u>inaugural ESG</u> <u>Impact Report</u> as well as <u>a revitalised Deck website</u> with enhanced features (including a <u>register of grant and tender opportunities</u>), and highlighted some of our future training and events including June's <u>CEO and Senior Leaders Forum</u> on the Gold Coast.

We are watching with interest for an upcoming announcement on the federal election, and are already working with national peaks and advocacy groups in anticipation of the spotlight that a national election campaign will throw across the needs represented by our sector.

Finally, we know that the Independent Review into Homelessness Response in Queensland, along with the Government's response, will soon be made available, and we will be connecting with stakeholders and service providers across the state to unpack the contents of these.


