From our Leadership Team

Defending the Liveable Design Standard

I recently met with the Minister for Housing and Public Works, together with Australians for Universal Design, Queenslanders with Disability Network (QDN), the Summer Foundation, and National Shelter, among others. We discussed the critical importance of retaining the <u>Liveable Design Standard</u> to ensure all new homes offer improved universal access.

The <u>Productivity Commission Interim Report</u>, handed down in the last few days, includes a preliminary recommendation suggesting that the Queensland Development Code be amended to opt out of accessibility standards and make them voluntary rather than mandatory. This would be a backwards step for Queensland. The cost of these design standards during construction is far less than the cost of retrofitting homes to achieve the same outcome.

Q Shelter considers these standards a form of prevention. They prevent people from struggling to find an accessible home that meets their needs. They prevent people from reaching out to service systems for assistance as their housing needs become more critical. We question the productivity gains from removing the standard, when the true cost of fewer accessible homes is borne by households who very often can't afford the modifications needed.

The standards are an example of upstream prevention rather than more costly downstream interventions. We urge productivity improvements to achieve more homes as quickly as possible, but those homes need to fit the profile of our community's needs.

Please consider making a submission to the <u>Productivity Commission Interim</u> <u>Report</u>. Q Shelter will be working with other organisations, including QDN, to make submissions and work together on community education and evidence-based reasons on why retaining the standard is a boost to productivity, rather than a barrier.

Homelessness Ministerial Advisory Council

Q Shelter recently co-chaired a HMAC sub-committee to examine solutions to challenges experienced in public spaces due to increased homelessness. All 12 SEQ councils were represented. We worked with Co-Chair Scott Smith from Council of Mayors SEQ (COMSEQ) to refine a list of actions from the meeting. This sub-committee will continue to meet every two months to progress actions that improve the integration of public space responses, and consider ways to add to the available supply of emergency accommodation.

HMAC also heard from the sub-committee working on Supportive Housing.

Q Shelter followed the discussion at HMAC with a letter to Minister O'Connor

outlining our commitment to Supportive Housing as a model that offers permanent, secure housing with wrap-around support for the duration of people's needs.

Homelessness Week: a focus on prevention

We acknowledge the <u>many activities that will take place next week for National Homelessness Week</u> to bring attention to the challenge of homelessness, and its solutions. Q Shelter is proud to be participating in the Lady Musgrave Trust's Annual Forum examining responses to homelessness experienced by women. We are leading an additional discussion after this forum, exploring how prevention can be embedded in our approach to ensure children and young people are not at risk of homelessness, and are appropriately supported to engage, thrive, and succeed.
