Special training update

Federal funding for homelessness peak bodies

On 6 March, the Federal Minister for Housing and Homelessness, Clare O'Neil, announced extra funding for housing and homelessness support, including \$6.2 million over three years to support leading homelessness peak bodies.

National Shelter have been in close contact with the Minister around this decision, and <u>have welcomed the announcement</u>, as well as the \$1 billion additional funding for more crisis and transitional accommodation for women and children fleeing family and domestic violence and for young people.

National Shelter have been advocating for thoughtful housing policy reform for 50 years, and this funding will ensure they can continue to work towards their vision of an affordable, fair and healthy housing system.



They have also released their 2025 Election Platform with a call to action to the Australian Government to fix the housing crisis.

Livable Housing Design in Queensland

Last month National Shelter and Q Shelter wrote to the Minister for Housing and Public Works on the subject of the ABCB Standard for Livable Housing Design.

The Shelter network understands that the housing industry has been advocating for these 2023 Modern Home Reforms to be revoked, and we urged the Minister to retain the Standard, which has the objective "to ensure that housing is designed to

meet the needs of the community, including older people and those with a mobility-related disability."

We encourage you to <u>read our letter to the Minister, Sam O'Connor</u>, and we will keep you updated on future developments.
